The information session will provide individuals with advice on eligibility criteria, program content and the commitment that is required to be selected as a participant on this program.

Specifically targeting people living within Belconnen and the wider region, this program will:

- Provide participants with a Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care (CHC30113) upon successful completion
- Deliver a First Aid Certificate in Early Childhood Settings
- Provide industry specific training designed in partnership with the Early Childhood Education and Care sector
- Provide real employment pathways within the Early Childhood Education and Care sector for participants who meet the criteria
- Provide industry based work placements within the Early Childhood Education and Care sector.

Commencing Monday 19 March 2018, this 6 month program, will run 4 days per week (Mon - Thurs, 30 hours per week) and be a combination of theory, and practical hands on learning and industry work experience.
